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## Building AA Capacity: State of Oregon's Drivers

- Advancing overarching toxics reduction and pollution prevention strategies
- Recent regulatory actions reference AA directly or indirectly:
  - 2015 Oregon Toxics-Free Kids Act
  - <u>Draft</u> industrial air toxics rules (Cleaner Air Oregon)



## Building AA Capacity: How is Oregon Supporting AA Work?

- Small/Mid-Size State Challenge: minimal dedicated resources
- Leveraging interstate resources and information
  - Interstate Chemicals Clearinghouse tools & workgroups
  - West Coast States MOU → common priority chemicals
- EPA P2 grants
  - Sponsoring trainings for agencies and businesses
  - AA research & analysis support (NW Green Chemistry)



## Building AA Capacity: Filling Gaps and Sustaining Support

- Incorporate AA principles (and risks of regrettable substitutions) into traditional environmental regulatory programs
- Formalize partnerships around common AA priorities
  - In-state, cross-state and cross-sector
- Build expertise within agencies through training and hiring practices
