Tim Malloy. [Moderator] Tim is a Professor of Law at the University of California Los Angeles. He also serves as the Faculty Director of the interdisciplinary UCLA Sustainable Technology and Policy Program. He joined the UCLA faculty in 1998, after spending a combined 11 years in practice at private firms and at the United States Environmental Protection Agency, Region III. Professor Malloy's research interests focus on environmental, chemical and nanotechnology policy, regulatory policy, and organizational theory, with particular emphasis on the relationship between regulatory design and implementation and

the structure of business organizations. Tim serves on the Executive Council of the Association for the Advancement of Alternatives Assessment.



Martin Wolf. Dr. Martin Wolf is Director of Authenticity and Sustainability at Seventh Generation where he creates the frameworks for design of sustainable household and personal care products. He also creates frameworks for more sustainable systems of commerce, and for working with other businesses, industry associations, legislators and regulators to implement those frameworks.
